#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**


Council adopted the Mobility Master Plan on 16th Feb 2021, within the plan are 12 recommendations to be carried out over the next 5 years. One recommendation is to "Investigate methods to improve transit ridership to 10%".



An effective and efficient transit system is at the core of the Mobility Master Plan philosophy of addressing inequity in our mobility systems by providing safe, efficient, and affordable travel options for all ages and abilities.



A Council strategy session was held in August 2021 where district staff provided an update on the progress of each of the 12 Mobility Master Plan recommendations. Council expressed a desire to undertake a District led study to assess all the potential options and take the first step in answering the question of "how does the District reach the 10% ridership goal?". This budget request will enable an initial assessment of all potential options that fully consider the Mobility Master Plan goals and how they can integrate into the communities Busing strategy.



In March 2022 Councill approved budget to undertake the Transit Study. A team of transportation and transit specialists from WATT Consulting Group have been retained to undertake the Option Analysis which is envisaged to be the first part of a multi-year Integrated Transit Strategy that will conclude with Council selecting a preferred option and adopting an implementation plan for delivering future transit services within Lake Country. More information of the proposed Integrated Transit Strategy is contained within the attached presentation.

#### **CONSULTATION AND COMMUNICATION**

The Option Analysis will draw upon existing public engagement data from related studies such as the Okanagan Household Survey, the Central Okanagan Transit Future Action Plan and the Lake Country Local Area Transit Plan. A workshop with Council is also planned to take place in July.






Increase ridership to 10% of 2019 annual ridership numbers (pre-COVID)


