Central Okanagan Public Schools - "Inside 23":

1. Primary Winter Gathering

The Indigenous Education's Primary Winter Gathering was held from January 10-13, 2023. It was an opportunity for all Grade Three Indigenous students to experience Indigenous cultures. The intentions of the day were to explore what it means to be Indigenous and to be proud of who they are, to learn about and celebrate their culture (regalia, dance, captikwl, drumming, song and storytelling), and to connect with Elders, community, friends and teachers. The students had an opportunity to dance to the drumming from local drummer group "Birch Creek". Asher described the highlights of participating in his first Primary Winter Gathering.

The American Sign Language (ASL) program offers secondary level courses to hearing, hard of hearing and deaf high school students. These courses are offered at Mount Boucherie Secondary, Rutland Senior Secondary and École Kelowna Secondary Schools. ASL is accepted as a second language requirement for University and Central Okanagan Public Schools is one of the only school districts in the province to offer in person instruction. The program is supported by a member of the deaf community. The ASL program began in 2000 with one class and it continues to grow. This school year, there have been over 20 classes offered between the three high schools. The ASL instructors shared information about the program and took trustees through a brief activity to build awareness and learn.

The British Columbia Association of Student Activity Advisors (BCASAA) has awarded Rutland Senior Secondary School (RSS) to be the host school of the 2023 British Columbia Student Leadership Conference (BCSLC). The conference is scheduled to take place on October 19 to 22, 2023 with the theme of *Back to Leadership — Recharge, Reconnect, Reimagine*. BCASAA has held an annual student leadership conference at various sites across the Province since 1991, with the goal to promote and enhance the development of student leadership in our schools, and empowering youth to be leaders in their communities. It is anticipated that 30 to 40 British Columbia provincial schools will be in attendance, represented by 350 to 450 student leaders and 30 to 40 advisors. Total attendance from Central Okanagan Public Schools will be approximately 204 students. The presenters arranged to date include Kevin Lamoureux, Tei Street, Sam Demma and Jacklyn Uweh. This is a cost neutral venture and will be funded by student registration and BCASAA sponsorship.
