



Community Health Centre

5,000+ sq. ft clinic that will offer primary care services delivered by nurse practitioners, family physicians, and nurses. Allied health services will also be offered including dietitian appointments, acute physiotherapy, as well as individual and family mental health appointments with a clinical social worker.



Social Services

Incorporate the social services that Lake Country Health Society already offers within the community, including mental health groups and workshops, a caregiver support program, harm reduction supplies, and seniors' services.



Expanded Programs

Lake Country Health also looks forward to expanding the programs and workshop offerings, as offerings are currently limited due to a lack of program space.

FUNDINGLake Country Health

The Lake Country Community Health Centre will be funded by the Ministry of Health BC, which has allocated \$1.818M annually for clinical staffing and overhead, and up to \$3.0M for one-time tenant improvement and equipment costs. Lake Country Health will contribute \$196K annually for the overhead discrepancy and will lead the capital project and tenant improvements.
