DESCRIPTION: An art project aimed to foster community engagement among youth and seniors while

revitalizing the artwork at the Skateboard Park and the two TownWalls

PURPOSE

Does the funding request from the Lake Country Art Gallery meet Council's intention for the Community Engagement Grant?

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Community Engagement Grant request in the amount of \$3,000 from the Lake Country Art Gallery for the fish:BOWL project be approved.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Starting in 2021, Council has an annual budget of \$15,000 for the Community Engagement Grant. The grant has proved to be a great tool for engagement and inclusion of community groups and organizations to deliver projects in partnership with the District to enhance the community.

The proposal that forms the basis of this report is a collaborative project spearheaded by the Lake Country Art Gallery in partnership with artist Troy Teichrib, Lake Country Seniors Society, Tapin: Creative Safe Space for Teens, local youth and the District's Parks, Recreation and Culture department. The project is slated for late May to early June, coinciding with warmer weather. Tapin: Creative Safe Space for Teens participants will have the opportunity to contribute to the Skateboard bowl's artwork, and seniors will be provided with materials and resources to lend their creative voices to the TownWalls.

This project aims to foster community engagement among youth and seniors while revitalizing the artwork at the Skateboard Park and the two TownWalls and will take place under the mentorship of urban UBCO MFA artist Troy Teichrib. Lake Country Art Gallery will oversee and coordinate all aspects of the project, including media, budgets, and supplies.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

This application embodies the concept for this grant when it was originally presented to Council and then subsequently supported. This grant was an opportunity for the community to come together with ideas along with funds or resources or support for their idea. While these involve differing levels of support from the District, the concept is the same, creating a better community.

APPLICABLE LEGISLATION, BYLAWS AND POLICY

Under section 8 of the Community Charter, Fundamental Powers, a municipality has the right to provide assistance except that Council must not provide a grant, benefit, advantage, or other form of assistance to a business including an exemption from a tax or fee (section 25). Business is defined as carrying on a commercial or industrial activity or undertaking of any kind and providing professional, personal, or other services for the purpose of gain or profit. Legislation does not define assistance to non-profit organizations although nearly all

municipalities in BC set out policies restricting funding to only non-profit organizations registered under the BC Corporate Registry. A non-profit is considered an organization, not a business under the Community Charter therefore, there is no prohibition on a municipality from providing assistance to non-profits as legislation only applies to businesses.
