Central Okanagan Public Schools - "Inside 23"

1. Indigenous Mentorship: Sharing Stories of Our Ways with the Yukon First Nation Education Directorate (YFNED)

Central Okanagan Public Schools' Indigenous Education Department and the Yukon First Nation Education Directorate (YFNED) have collaborated to share promising practices and cultural teachings for the past six years. During Spring Break of 2024, Nathan Elliott (Principal, Central Programs and Services), Simone Gauthier (Lead Advocate), Christie Russell (District Vice-Principal - Indigenous Education), and Tyna Smith (Indigenous Student Advocate) journeyed to the 5th Annual First Nation Education Conference in Yukon to present at the pre-conference and learn from the people and the land of the Kwanlin Dün First Nation and the Ta'an Kwäch'än Council. The team from Central Okanagan Public Schools were graciously hosted by Melanie Bennett, YFNED Executive Director, and team, and were deeply honoured to engage in reciprocal learning in the Yukon. Central Okanagan Public Schools staff engaged in learning around the theme of mentorship within Indigenous communities and schools, with the intent of fostering holistic educational environments.

In 2023 MBSS joined the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) School Network which includes over 12,000 schools in 182 countries, including 100 schools from Canada. As a Canadian UNESCO school, the students engage in student-led initiatives, and school-wide events that serve four thematic action areas: UNESCO's mission and the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals, Global Citizenship Education, Education for Sustainable Development and Climate Action, and Indigenous Education and Reconciliation. One of the goals of the MBSS Sustainability Plan is to give back to the environment. This includes a composting project that allows the school community to connect with the land and learn more about composting and the positives of it, as well as planter boxes to grow fruits, vegetables and flowers.

The four students presenting were selected to be a part of the 25-member, Canadian Commission UNESCO National Youth Council and therefore had the opportunity to attend the CCUNESCO National Conference in Toronto.

After raising \$6,400 last year, the Walk exceeded their fundraising goal by raising over \$13,806 this year with the proceeds to Foundry Kelowna.

The Mission of Kelowna ICE is dedicated to reducing the sexual exploitation of children. This includes the continued effort to identify and rescue children being offended against, and to identify, pursue and disrupt online offenders who possess and traffic in Child Sexual Abuse material. Kelowna ICE investigates online offences involving child victims, including child pornography offences, online luring, sextortion, and physical offences such as sexual interference, sexual assault, and child luring. The presentation made to the Board of Education is similar to the presentation by Crown Counsel and the RCMP to Law classes in all five of the Central Okanagan Public Schools secondary schools.

The Board of Education set the community rental rates, effective July 1, 2024, and approved the amendments to Appendix 650A – Public Use of School Facilities – Schedule of Rental Fees. The amendments include a new community rental classification. The three classifications, effective July 1st, will consist of: Community & Educational Partners (previously non profit), Youth and Adult Athletics (new) and Commercial (previously for profit).
