ITEM TITLE: 2024-2025 BC Transit Annual Operating Agreement

DESCRIPTION: To authorize execution of the Annual Operating Agreement for BC Transit service

PURPOSE

An Annual Operating Agreement, between the District of Lake Country and BC Transit, is required to be authorized to continue the current level of transit service in Lake Country.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the 2024-2025 Annual Operating Agreement between the District of Lake Country and BC Transit, for transit service, for the period April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025 be authorized.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BC Transit has provided the Annual Operating Agreement (AOA), for the term of April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025, to staff, in early May 2024. The District is required to execute and return the Agreement to BC Transit by June 30, 2024.

Provisions in the AOA establish the term, as well as costs, fares, and service levels of the BC Transit service within Lake Country, namely routes 23 and 32. The route 90 service between Vernon and UBCO, with stops in Lake Country, is operated through a separate agreement between BC Transit and the Regional District of North Okanagan. The HandyDART services, available to Lake Country customers, is operated through a separate agreement between BC Transit and the City of Kelowna. Over the term of the 2024-2025 AOA, staff will work closely with BC Transit to monitor the services and gauge opportunities for improvements, and as a valuable barometer for initiatives related to the District's ongoing transit study. Until the District's Integrated Transit Study is complete and the implementation plan created, the District is not in a position to ascertain whether there are any alternative options to provide transit services. Therefore, the continued use of the shared service model with BC Transit is considered essential in order that the residents of Lake Country have access to public transit.

In their AOA covering letter, BC Transit notes that in the fall of 2023, ridership had made a full recovery to prepandemic levels. Relieved of the recovery efforts, BC Transit is focusing on a number of innovations and investments going forward. These include the recently implemented Umo electronic fare system, a technology driven on-demand service in Kelowna and integration of battery powered buses. Capital infrastructure improvements are being established and an updated Strategic Plan in 2024 will guide priorities in an evolving environment.

The Annual Operating Agreement 2024-2025 outlines a net cost to the District of \$160,162.00 for the District's 6.34% share of regional costs for the Kelowna Conventional Transit Service – route 23. The net cost to the District for Community Transit Service – route 32, is \$896,041.00 reflecting 5.44% share of regional costs.

The total net cost of \$1,056,203.00 is within the approved budget and authorizing the 2024-2025 Annual Operating Agreement ensures continuity of the current transit services.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

Terms in the 2024-2025 Annual Operating Agreement are materially consistent with the prior year operating agreement.

Monitoring of the transit operations and the services provided through the AOA is managed within existing staff resources.
