### Lake Country Community Highlights

- Cst. Viejou and Cst. Hazlewood are nominated for Team Alexa for removing more than 24 impaired drivers each from the streets of Lake Country in 2023
- Search Warrant was executed on a residence on Copper Hill Place - 4 motorbikes stolen from Alberta were recovered. Investigation is ongoing
- Officers assisted with traffic control and participated in the Oyama Day parade. Officers handed out candy, tattoos and stickers to youth while interacting with attendees
- Officers arrested the same two individuals for possession of stolen property. First they had a stolen truck and the second time they had a stolen boat. Both vehicles were stolen from Alberta. Investigations are ongoing
