

Regional Updates


Introducing Umo

- Ability to pay with Umo Mobility App or reloadable smart card
- Cash will remain payment option
- New source of data on fare usage and transit ridership
- Reduce barriers for riding transit with improved accessibility
- Improved flexibility with fare options and programs



On-Demand Project

- New service which uses technology to dynamically dispatch a bus to locations dictated by customers
- Launched for April 28 in Kelowna, Crawford neighborhood
- 100 riders, about 1,000 rides
 - 1.9 averaging boardings per hour
- Potential Phase 2 location options being discussed



"Hardy" Operations and Maintenance Facility

- Designed for 70 buses
- Today 110 buses
- Undergoing \$9.1M refurbishment
- Restructuring of the existing parking to accommodate new Battery Electric Buses and improve operational efficiency
- Adding ~13 bus bays
- Forecast completion Summer 2025

"Hollywood" Operations and Maintenance Facility

- BC Transit currently developing Business Case
 - Planning / Business Case supported by federal funding
- Costing and preliminary design work underway
 - Funding options analysis incorporating new federal funding information
- Planned initial capacity ~180 buses (battery electric & other)
- Earliest possible completion 2029/30
 - Likely completion 2031
- Will require extensive regional collaboration and approvals

Federal Funding Programs

- \$3 billion per year for public transit infrastructure, starting in 2026/27, split across 3 funding streams
- Lake Country / Kelowna RTS eligible for two streams:
 - Baseline Funding: Support for routine growth and rehabilitation
 - Metro-Region Agreements: Ten-year agreement based on development and approval of Integrated Regional Plan.
- BC Transit will lead applications













- Immediate recommendation is to improve span of service, weekday
- BC Transit has brought forward an MOU to support recommendation
- LATP route change recommendation to be completed when the Rt 97/23 change happens



Rt 97 + 23 changes

Local routing changes to match recommendation in the LATP by BC Transit

23 Lake Country Frequent

What is the change being proposed?

- Rt 23 is shortened to become a fully local route, operates only in District of Lake Country
- Hours from the Rt 23 are used to extend the Rt 97 to the District
 - What do the Rt 97 + 23 modifications mean for the District
 - Routing
 - Frequency
 - Span of Service
 - Costs
 - Capital investment
 - Impacts
